10 Years and Growing. RTSTT is Here to Stay!

"To say that 2020 has been a challenging year would be an understatement. Preceded by a disrupted 2019, the core team at RTSTT has had to regroup, review, and transform events, awareness campaigns and fundraising initiatives, to create a *virtual global presence*.

Hearing the voices of young adults who drive RTSTT, the charity decided early on not to let the pandemic hamper student initiatives or silence awareness campaigns. In fact, *RTSTT's work has never been more important*. Millions of vulnerable families and individuals find themselves without access to freedom, safety, and basic, primary human necessities for dignity and survival.

Following the directives of the Hong Kong Government in 2019 and 2020, key 24 Hour Race and Peak 24 initiatives, which are driven from the Hong Kong hub, have had to be postponed, first in Hong Kong, and eventually around the world.

Consequently, the 24 Hour Race and Peak 24 revenue, as well as revenue from other fundraising efforts, has been seriously affected, Regretfully, RTSTT has experienced its toughest financial year.

We know RTSTT does not stand alone and that NGO's across the world are faced with unprecedented challenges. The core team feels encouraged by the financial support, albeit minimal, that the Hong Kong Government offered NGO's, signifying its recognition and endorsement of what RTSTT continues to do as an Hong Kong-registered charity.

Since 2010, RTSTT has grown to become the *world's leading student-led movement combatting the scourge of modern day slavery*.

RTSTT initiatives are organised by youth for youth.

As a Board we believe in and applaud a generation of youth, who are fully aware of the scourge of modern day slavery. They are leaders across all languages, cultures and borders, who are resourceful, equipped and poised to make a difference, through whichever industry, field or walk of life they choose.

Fundraising is one of the core reasons why the RTSTT exists. Through 24 Hour Races around the world, thousands of high school students have fundraised over **HK\$10 Million** in a fight against slavery. We have worked with formidable charitable partners in projects and efforts to helps boys, girls, men, and women escape the bond of slavery.

This year, RTSTT established a partnership A21 to rebuild a Child Advocacy Centre (CAC) in Pattaya, Thailand.

What is #OperationCAC?

Rebuilding Child Advocacy Centre

#OperationCAC is a year-long partnership with A21 to deliver a global blow to human trafficking.

The CAC Pattaya is designed to assist officers working on the ground in conducting cases against child sex offenders, child traffickers and online crimes against children. The CAC model creates a safe environment where child victims of trafficking and sexual exploitation are able to speak to forensically trained interviewers about trauma they have experienced or witnessed. Furthermore, the CAC in Pattaya is equipped to provide skills and educational training to at risk families and survivors, in addition to professional training to first responders and professionals working in the child protection field.

This project needs **US\$ 100k** from start to completion in order to be successful.

These deliberately small workshops offer a great opportunity for students to hear from a host of professionals on topics like leadership, communication, Covid-19's impact on slavery, and more.






Youth Empowerment Conferences


Student Leadership



8-10 month selective leadership journey with RTSTT

Everything we do as a charity we do through youth. Students from around the world apply to intern with RTSTT for a 8-10 month period. We believe that as we equip young minds we are able to transform students to become social entrepreneurs and innovators. Our aim is to empower by offering mentorship, structure, and guidance throughout the process of organising various RTSTT initiatives.

RTSTT establishes business rules, feedback, and support systems for student leaders and allows them to map out a plan to develop the resources, partners, and support to build a 24 Hour Race, conference, or other events. Despite a strategic framework in place for the students, the Race will pose a constructive and inspiring challenge requiring the students' perseverance, creativity, and determination to be a force for good.

Our famous 24 Hour Race

Since 2010, more than 10,000 runners have taken part in our 24 Hour Race that raises funds and awareness about modern day slavery.

One runner per team will run as many laps as he/she can before handing over the baton to their teammate. There will be one runner per team running at all times. They will run as many laps as they can before handing over the baton to their team mate. Each lap is counted upon completion. The team who has collectively run the most number of laps wins. All participating students are required to have strict adult supervision.




Incubators

Seeding Campaigns

2-3 month mentored project-building competition

Throughout the year we give high school and university students the opportunity to bring their idea to life by joining our completely free, 2-3 month seeding campaigns, during which they work with RTSTT mentors and voluntary professional.

Dozens of students have already taken part in our campaign creating some exciting projects. As interest grows, RTSTT will select projects that copmlement and add value to our mission statement.





Corporate Events

Peak24 - annual corporate fundraising and awareness race

Our Peak24 corporate race is an unforgettable event where teams of 5 run a full marathon in relay-style. Set on one of Hong Kong's most iconic running tracks, the event offers teams a chance to challenge themselves in order to support the fight against modern slavery.

Peak24 has engaged over 50 large companies in Hong Kong, raising more than HKD 2 million.







Our history at a glance

It all started in Hong Kong 2010 when a visionary, endurance athlete from Li Po Chun, United World College, had the foresight to unite youth endurance with philanthropy in an event known as the 24 Hour Race.

The idea was simple; student teams would compete in an entirely student-led, endurance relay-race, over the course of 24 hours to raise awareness and funds to fight scourge of against human trafficking.

Since 2010, RTSTT has seen student initiatives in Hong Kong to Singapore, Kuala Lumpur, Seoul, Dhaka, New York San Francisco, London, Cardiff, and Sydney and has quickly become a leader in the abolitionist movements.






ANNUAL REPORT 2020 | 24 HOUR RACE









Since 2010, we have trained more than 700 student leaders and worked with over 12,000 youths from 250 schools. Through various awareness initiatives projects we have able been to support the freedom of over 2,000 victims of captivity, contributed fund dozens of rehabilitations centres, and indirectly enable local lawenforcement to put traffickers behind bars.



The 24 Hour Race creates positive community activities within the cities they are presented in. *The race helps students feel empowered to make changes to the world around them and also helps them realise the importance of their actions.* Not only has the race helped those who have been placed in the unfortunate circumstance of modern day slavery through fund raising and donations, the race has created a ripple effect of advocacy that dismantles the very systems that allow these things to happen. For example, the race teaches students about the effects that their consumption habits have.

A large part of this is through the purchase of fast fashion, that cause the demand for slave labour in less fortunate countries. This helps students to reflect and switch their habits toward more sustainable ones, causing a small ripple effect that could lower the demand of fast fashion, and in turn destroy the very system that requires the use of slave labour.

Personally, the race has allowed me to make personal connections with teachers, students and parents around the globe. It has given a strong network of like minded individuals, driven for change. It has taught me so many applicable real life skills that I feel will help me in the future. It definitely gave me a boost in terms of my interpersonal and professional abilities. 


